Talmudical Yeshiva of Philadelphia

Qualified men of the Orthodox Jewish faith are eligible for admission to the Talmudical Yeshiva of Philadelphia, without regard to race, color, national origin or physical handicap.

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 states that, "No otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall solely by reason of his/her handicap be excluded from the participating in, be denied the benefits of or be subjected to discrimination, under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance."

The Talmudical Yeshiva of Philadelphia is committed to the encouragement and support that are crucial in guaranteeing all qualified students the same educational experience and environment, as well as the equal opportunity to learn and study at the institution.

As such, the Yeshiva's facilities are fully accessible to the handicapped student. The main study hall is on ground level and totally wheelchair accessible. The building that houses the cafeteria has a ramp, and there is ample housing on the ground floor of the dormitory. In addition, the Yeshiva is prepared to make special arrangements, within reason, for the additional accommodation of any handicapped student.
